

Dreamworld Opens WhiteWater World on the Gold Coast

Since taking over the Dreamworld Theme Park in 1998 Macquarie Leisure Operators Limited (part of the Macquarie Leisure Group Trust) have invested in a number of leading edge thrill rides to become the premier Theme Park in Australia today.

Looking to expand the Dreamworld experience, investigations for a new water park began in 2005. A site on the southern side of the existing theme park was selected and a concept design prepared by US based firm Water Technology Inc. RCP were appointed as Project Managers and Programmers in March 2005 for the development of the \$58 million WhiteWater World project.

WhiteWater World comprises 7 major rides including only the second, linear motor driven, water raft roller coaster in the world, as well as a wave pool with 5 electric blowers capable of generating boogie board waves over 1.2m high. For the smaller water fans, there is the Nickelodeon themed "tipping bucket" water play fortress and slides and for the toddlers, a "Wiggles"



themed pool and slides. To service the pools there are 3 plant rooms and a leading edge filtration system that reduced backwash water consumption by 99%. Together with a storm water catchment and recycling system the park is the most water efficient in Australia.

The site was previously used for over flow parking and was divided by the old Pacific Highway, so the RCP team lead by Associate Ian Kaye, immediately acted to have some major power and telecoms assets relocated, whilst a full town planning application was being prepared and then assessed by the Gold Coast City Council.

Contracts for the construction of a 2,150 space car park and over flow parking areas were let in November 2005 and the Managing Contractor for the water park works was appointed in January 2006.

By mid 2006 the pools were well underway, the steel towers were erected ready for the USA and Canada manufactured rides and slides to commence. The RCP team guided the project to a handover to the Client ahead of programme on 4 December 2006 to allow preparation for the peak trading period in the December / January holiday period.



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RCP Opens Wellington Office

KPMG Offices, Brisbane

RCP were commissioned by KPMG as Project Managers and Programmers for the fitout of approximately 6,035m² office space, over 5 levels in Riparian Plaza, Brisbane. The project was initiated in May 2006 and was completed both under budget and one month ahead of schedule which enabled KPMG to achieve its business expansion objectives.

The fitout design complements KPMG's future business needs requiring a flexible workplace where teamwork is encouraged through a collaborative working environment and reflects KPMG's position as a leader in its market.

The fast-track nature of the project program was the greatest challenge for the project team. From the outset, continuous momentum to progress quickly through the

design stage and maintaining constant interaction with the Client throughout this phase of the project helped to ensure Client approvals were obtained promptly and design changes during construction were minimised. This allowed construction works to continue smoothly on site.

RCP's role included the procurement and management of a design team and head contractor from inception to final completion and occupation.



Queens Plaza, Brisbane

RCP Brisbane were engaged by Colonial First State Property Management in March 2006 as Project Manager/Principals Representative for the construction of the second stage of the prestigious Queens Plaza Retail project on Brisbane's Queen Street Mall. Stage 2 of the project has included the completion of a 1,500m² Coles Central supermarket and a dozen specialty stores to complement the 60 existing upmarket fashion retailers constructed in Stage 1. The balance of the development will include 3,000m² of commercial office space and the fitout of a 27,000m² David Jones store – its Queensland flagship.

Owned by Colonial First State Retail Trust, Queens Plaza will be completed at an overall development cost of approximately \$300 million.

The project involves the retention of two heritage listed buildings including the old Finneys building constructed in 1909 – an icon of early Brisbane – and the challenges of construction adjacent to the

trading first stage of the development. The major focus for the Stage 2 works is the seamless addition of space where new fitouts and department store concessions dovetail into the existing stage with minimal disruption to the operating centre.

Base building works are programmed for completion by mid 2007.



SKYCITY Casino

RCP, acting as Project Managers for Sky City Auckland Limited, have successfully completed the construction of the Aces Bar and The Noodle Bar at Auckland's SKYCITY Casino. This project represents Stage 1 of a NZ\$40 million, 15 stage refurbishment of the entire gaming floor.

Aspec Construction commenced on site on 25 September 2006 with a requirement that the facility be operating prior to Christmas 2006. Keeping to the tight programme proved particularly challenging with the requirement that the existing facilities continue to operate 24 hours, 7 days a week. This resulted in the construction team working around the clock.

The project was delivered to the Client on programme. The RCP team responsible for the delivery of this project were Nick Beale, Bruce McDonald and Mark Pearson. The concept design was created by Friedmutter Group out of

Las Vegas. Construction documentation was prepared by Moller Architects, Beca, Booth Sweetman Wolf, Point of View and Greet Consulting.
